Mr. Monson stated that he will vote "no" for every professional appointment because he objected to "no-bid" contracts and that he would not vote to approve any "no-bid" contract, even though he had no objection to the professionals that were being appointed.

Mr. Kondracki reminded Mr. Monson that, under the law, professional contracts and certain other types of contracts are not bid, but are advertised as Requests For Proposals. The reason is that a governmental entity has the right to select its professionals based upon their knowledge, reputation, skill and ability and not just on the basis of the lowest price. If bids are submitted based on an hourly rate, an inexperienced professional may bid a lower hourly rate to get the contract, but take longer to perform the work, costing ratepayers more. Mr. Kondracki stated that the Authority advertised for RFP's according to law and that no others submitted proposals other than the incumbents. Proposals are similar to bids in that cost is one consideration, but is not the only consideration. Every other qualified professional in New Jersey had the ability to submit a proposal but did not do so. Mr. Kondracki stated that the Authority is in full compliance with the law.

Mr. Kondracki stated that some contracts can only go out under an RFP because the services are incapable of being specified

B. DRIVER SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND ALCOHOL MISUSE:

The Authority will receive the water discharged as a result of the Turnpike's project. The Authority engineer will review the Turnpike project and determine the connection fee. Mr. Hartman informed the Board that TRC approved the Authority's choice of CDM for the Authority's energy audit.

SOLICITOR:

Mr. Kondracki discussed his meeting with Omni Environmental. Mr. Kondracki suggested that the Authority may benefit from Omni's presentation on solar energy. Mr. Kondracki provided a report for this month's activities.

ENGINEER:

Mr. Czekanski provided a report of monthly activities. The report is attached.
