# Executive Director's Report

### March 17, 2014

Mr. Eustace reported that on Friday, March 7<sup>th</sup>, Howard Spencer of J.A. Montgomery Risk Management met with Mr. Dansbury and Mr. Eustace as part of a JIF Risk Management inspection. Mr.Eustace further reported that the inspection went well.

On Tuesday March 11<sup>th</sup>, Mr. Eustace informed the Board that he gave a presentation for Bordentown City Green Team on the Authority's Energy Audit and the improvements that were made to the plant.

Mr. Eustace reported on the AEA conference he attended on March  $12^{\text{th}}$  . in Atlantic City

Mr. Eustace asked for the Board's permission to attend a National Water Environment Association leadership conference in Weehawken NJ on March 26<sup>th</sup>,27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. The conference will be at no cost to the Authority, as expenses will be paid by New Jersey Water Environment Association.

# BORDENTOWN SEWERAGE AUTHORITY ENGINEER'S STATUS REPORT FOR MARCH 2014 MEETING PREPARED BY REMINGTON VERNICK & ARANGO (RV&A) ENGINEERS

### **PLANT TOPICS**

• Energy Reduction Improvements: The project includes bar screen replacement, variable frequency drives on the oxygenation tank motors, replacement of the utility water system pumps/motors/vfd's, a new mixing system for the sludge holding tanks and addition of a secondary sludge conveyor in the sludge dewatering building.

The NJDEP has requested a closeout meeting in early April. The contractor has minor items to address. Board acceptance of maintenance bonds will probably occur next month.

### **DEVELOPMENT TOPICS:**

• Bordentown Waterfront Community: The applicant's engineer has prepared a treatment works permit modification package. We have provided the BSA with a draft letter to utilize for endorsement of the modification. The modification is for 152 lineal feet of 4" diameter force main piping that will be aligned under the NJ Transit tracks.

In addition, the original location for the pump station for the entire project on the river side of the railroad tracks is being proposed for the Phase II pump station location.

- Team Campus: No activity.
- Thorntown Lane Development: Review comments provided for 8 new residential units on a project that was dormant for five years.
- Dunkin Donuts: New Application: A freestanding building within the Route 130 Bottom Dollar parking lot is proposed. Minor review comments have been provided. Details have not been provided to date but the applicant is proposing an interior grease trap.

- Route 206 Infrastructure Improvements:
  - Interchange 7 Warehouse: A meeting was held with Trammel Crow representatives on Wednesday February 12<sup>th</sup>. We discussed the economic commitment that was required in order to permit the wastewater to enter the system and the representatives felt it was excessive. No activity since.
  - Central Crossing Building Number 1: On Friday March 14<sup>th</sup> Mr. Eustace and RV personnel met with the applicant's engineer to discuss review comments for Building 1. Since no facilities are being dedicated to the BSA all the comments were provided verbally for the applicant's engineer's consideration. We have provided the BSA with a draft letter to utilize for endorsement of the TWA modification for a small amount of additional flow beyond what was included in the original permit.
  - Route 206 Bypass Force Main: The Treatment Works permit modification application has been deemed complete and is under review by the NJDEP.
